They say the very best CEOs have something in common with the very best Generals. They have the ability to make good decisions with very little information. The business environment, like the battlefield, changes quickly. The CEO has to decide if the company will expand a new product line. Will that product continue to show growth or will it fizzle out? The General has to decide where to commit his troops. Will the enemy continue pressing forward at this location, or will the main offensive appear somewhere else?

Both men would feel tempted to wait for more information. Don't expand the product line, don't commit the troops; until we know for sure what is happening. However, by the time a clear picture emerges, the time for deciding has already passed by. It's too late to expand the product line when your competitor has soaked up all the market share. It's too late to move the troops when your enemy has started to attack. In order to make decisions quickly, leaders rely on their gut. Their past experiences have taught them how to feel in similar situations. So even without knowing all the information, they have a sense for what will happen. They trust their gut.

Christians deal with a similar problem of imperfect information. We don't understand everything about God. We don't remember all the details of what the Bible says. And sometimes the Bible says things that don't seem to make sense to us. How will we decide what to do? Like those CEOs and Generals, we have to go with our gut. We have to trust that God's way will turn out better than our way. We let our love for God guide our decisions. This is why the Bible says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart." Your heart knows that Jesus loves you more than you can possibly know. Your heart knows that God has the power to transform even disaster into blessing.

So you don't have to know the reasoning behind every commandment. You just trust that when you honor God's name and treat his word as holy, God will bless you. Make no mistake, more knowledge is always better. You will be better off knowing that God's name means everything that he is and does and that he revealed his name in order to save those who call on him. You will be better off knowing that the Holy Spirit works through the word to transform the human heart and Jesus himself is described as "the word made flesh." But you don't have to know all those details. Just follow the commandment and God will bless you.

As we go through life we will face many situations where our understanding fails us. We don't know all the details. We can't tell what's going on. We don't understand how something works. But we survive by trusting our gut. Trust that God's way is the best way. Our Savior will lead us on the right path.


Trustee's Report: There was a small leak in the basement bathroom which has been addressed. Also, work continues on the steeple lighting and the leak from the roof.

Our worship all weekend centered around Jesus as our sure foundation in this world of uncertainty. The ladies of the Minnekota Circuit created a warm atmosphere at the Sioux Falls Convention Center, even though the weather outside was cooler than most conventions! The 60 LWMS circuits together gathered \$50,182.62 for the Home Missions: Equipment Fund and the same amount for World Missions: Native American Projects. The offerings gathered on Thursday and Sunday at convention were split between Home Missions: 100 Missions in 10 Years and World Missions: Europe Projects. In the kickoff to the 20th anniversary of kids c.a.r.e., we celebrated that over \$43,000 was gathered last year for World Missions: Missionary Kids Retreats and looked forward to supporting our Home Mission in Antigua this year! Other presentations taught us how to make hay here at home while the sun shines, how our team in Africa has adapted to an ever-changing mission scene, and so much more. Friendships were created and renewed, and lots of hugs were given. We pray that everyone left the convention looking forward to telling their congregations how amazing it was!

Our theme was <u>Jungle Journey</u> which taught the seven C's of History: Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, Christ, Cross, and Consummation. 
